NATHAN'S NOTIONS

Giving Together for the Mission

The Bible speaks frequently and passionately about giving. In fact, the word "give" appears roughly 2,162 times in the Bible, in addition to over 2,300 other passages that discuss the concepts of giving, generosity, money and possessions. The Bible has more to say about giving than it does faith and prayer combined. Why then do individuals and churches have a hard time letting go of their money? Fear. Either fear that they will not have enough to meet their needs or fear that they cannot trust where their money goes after they give it.

The Bible says many things about giving, we will just consider a few of them.

We should give joyfully. "The point is this: The person who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the person who sows generously will also reap generously. Each person should do as he has decided in his heart — not reluctantly or out of compulsion, since God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Corinthians 9:6-7 CSB). When we give joyfully, we do so with the trust that God will meet our needs and that He will distribute funds to best advance His kingdom. We ask that each church considers giving to the cooperative program and to the association. When you give to the cooperative program you assist in sending out missionaries in North America and around the world, help provide literature, help provide education to seminary students, help church planters, and many other things. When you give to the association you help support Schafer Baptist Camp, the Baptist Center, the Christian Dental Mission, collective evangelism, jail ministry, collegiate ministry, disaster relief, missions, youth ministry, WMU, and many other things.

We should give sacrificially. "We want you to know, brothers and sisters, about the grace of God that was given to the churches of Macedonia: During a severe trial brought about by affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. I can testify that, according to their ability and even beyond their ability, of their own accord, they begged us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in the ministry to the saints" (2 Corinthians 8:1-4 CSB). Giving sacrificially gives us the opportunity to depend upon and receive the blessings of God that we did not anticipate. He has a way of supplying all our needs when we give to Him.

We should give generously. "Give, and it will be given to you; a good measure — pressed down, shaken together, and running over — will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you" (Luke 6:38 CSB). When we give in abundance, we get to witness God using our resources combined with others to advance His kingdom in tremendous ways. When we give from a generous heart, we feel the warmth of satisfaction knowing that we have done what we could to help others and give more opportunities to introduce people to Jesus.

We should give out of a pure heart. "Then the people rejoiced because of their leaders' willingness to give, for they had given to the Lord wholeheartedly. King David also rejoiced greatly" (1 Chronicles 29:9 CSB). We should not expect anything back from God because of our giving to Him. We should have no ulterior motives, just the joy of giving for kingdom worth.

We should give because God first gave to us. "For God loved the world in this way: He gave his one and only Son, so that everyone who

believes in him will not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16 CSB).

We want to highlight a church in our association that exemplifies each of these characteristics mentioned above: Bethabara Baptist Church.

March 9, 2026 - Board Meeting, Maceo Baptist Church

Call to Order (7:00) - The meeting was called to order by "the power invested in" Conner Reed who called Bro. Tim Moss to come "expel his wisdom on us."

Welcome, Scripture, and Prayer (7:00) - Bro. Tim provided a few housekeeping items regarding restrooms. He expressed his appreciation to those members who provided a meal. He shared from Philippians 1:3. He shared about the "shared commitment" we have. We are outposts of the same kingdom. "He who began a good work in you" (Philippians 1:6) is one of the most encouraging verses in the New Testament. He shared that there are seasons when ministry is difficult, but God finishes. He shared regarding the example of how Paul prays; that is for love - not for success or large numbers or worry and hassle-free ministry. Are we as DMBA churches the kind of churches Paul would thank God for? Do we share the mission? Are we trusting the builder? Are we growing in Christlike love?

Attendance Check (7:06) - Shea Hicks, as clerk, confirmed that as of the call to order, forty-eight (48) messengers as well and twenty-one (21) guests had recorded their attendance and that quorum had been met.

Recognition of New Board Members and Staff (7:06) - The following new staff were recognized as new board members.

- Clyde Skimmerhorn of Whitesville Baptist as interim pastor.

Guest Speaker (7:08) - Bro. Conner Reed welcomed Jesse Harrell, Chaplain with Daviess County Detention Center and the Good News Global and Jail Ministry. Good News Global Jail Ministry serves inmates at DCDC. There are a variety of ideas, and he has an opportunity to point them to Christ and say, "You may feel like you have ruined your life completely..., but you don't have to spend eternity separated from God." Many inmates request bibles and many of these are provided by the DMBA. These interactions allow him to be salt and light because of you.

Approval of the Previous Minutes (7:12) - A motion was made for the approval of the minutes of the January meeting. The motion was made by Larry Barker and received a second from Tim Moss. **The motion was approved** by bright yellow ballot.

Finance Report (7:14) - Bro. Tom Pelphrey brought a report on behalf of the finance committee. Report was made available on pages 12-16. He noted that the association is in an area of transition as the finance committee moves from bookkeeping services with Theresa Hayden to services with Connections Group.

We have made changes to the accounting software we use that will serve us both now and in the future. Bro. Tom noted that he is the one who serves as Connections Group. This software, Fund Accounting, is specifically made for churches and associations like ours. At this time, "we have had to go back to October 1st and enter every check, deposit and transaction" because there was not a way to import. The financial report is a new format and only includes the general fund at this time. He noted that deposits and expenditures provided a \$4,872 positive report for January but February ended with a deficit of \$6,506. Bro. Tom also noted that while the current report is incomplete, the full report will be emailed to executive board members. There is an email address that has been created for any questions regarding finances. This email will allow anyone who is in the financial position to have access to past questions and progress. Bro. Larry Barker made a **motion to approve the report. The motion was seconded and approved** by ballot.

AMS Report (7:21) - Dr. Nathan Whisnant shared his report from pages 17-18. He shared regarding the following upcoming events.

- REACH tomorrow (March 10th) at Westfork Baptist Church from 8-12.
- Pastor Staff Appreciation Dinner at Buck Creek on March 12th at 6pm, with special prizes and entertainment by Blue Bridge Boys. 80 people signed up and we have ordered food for 100, so we have room for more.
- There will be Block Party Trailer Training on March 14th.
- Pleasant Grove Baptist will be hosting a Sexual Abuse Prevention Training on March 15th from 4pm-6pm.
- The Associational Youth Revival will be at Maceo Baptist on March 19-21 with different preachers each night.
- There will be Disaster Relief Training in Henderson. Dr. Whisnant will be attending the AMS track and an additional training. There is a small charge and you can register at the KBC website. The goal is to bring Hope and Healing.
- He will be doing Evangelism training at Karns Grove at 5pm on March 22nd and at Bethabara Baptist for two Sundays, April 26th and May 2nd at 6:30. Others are welcome to attend. Dr. Whisnant is available to do training at other churches by request.
- Dr. Whisnant will be taking vacation from April 6th-12th.
- He will be attending the Boomers Senior Celebration at Southside Baptist Church in Princeton, KY.
- There will be a DMBA Youth event at Calhoun Baptist Church on April 25th featuring Tanner Ward preaching and a Don Ready concert.
- May 7th is the National Day of Prayer.
- The next Executive Board meeting will be May 11th at Bethel Baptist Church at 7pm. A meal will not be provided.
- He is featuring different churches as part of "Nathan's Notions" on the DMBA newsletter. This is based on what he is writing, and this edition's theme was "Praying Together" and featured Karns Grove and Livermore Baptist. The last edition featured Redhill Baptist Church.

Committee, Ministry, and Program Unit Reports (7:30-8:07)

(7:30) **Missions Development** - Bro. Jerry Robertson shared the committee's report from page 19. After providing a few minutes for the Board to read, he shared scripture from Matthew 9:36-38 and expressed appreciation for Joanna Kendall and her leadership on the committee and then provided remarks regarding the "8 procedures by which the committee will work with churches to enhance mission development."

- Regarding point 1 - Establishing a communication system - they are working to provide a point of contact with every church. They want to help promote and support missions endeavors across the association.
- Regarding point 4 - Encouraging missions praying - They are seeking to promote the power of prayer. We have 11 missionaries we are praying for. Seven of these are part of the Eastern Kentucky Ministry and four of these are part of our Cincinnati partnership. Bro. Jerry shared that while official members of the committee is limited to 6, they are always seeking unofficial members who will pray. Pray for NAMB and the Annie Armstrong Offering. Bro. Nathan Whisnant provided names of our new Cincinnati missionaries. Bro. Jerry encouraged us to pray especially for those Muslims who at this time of Ramadan are especially praying and are especially open during the final "Night of Power." May they have dreams and visions of Jesus. Bro. Nathan provided prayer.

Bro. Matt Boyd asked regarding the 8 Procedures if these change anything regarding the policies and procedures. Bro. Jerry stated that it does not, but rather is how the committee seeks to carry out its duties.

(7:43) **Nominating Committee and Jail Ministry** - Ms. Marijane McNeil provided new names for those who will serve through 2028. The Nominating Committee will have Buddy Ralph and the Finance Committee will have Jordan Bostick. Rose Ayers will join the Jail Ministry and Robert Carter will join the Travis Estate Fund. Tony Shouse will join the Wilson Trust Fund. Preston Blanton and Ryan Sosh will join the Youth Ministry. Kam Len Haokip and Brenda McKinney will join the Missions Development Committee. There were no questions for the committee. The names for new ministries were approved by the board.

Regarding the Jail Ministry, Marijane provided an update on their 2nd Inmate ministry. We will be providing a phone card again and providing a pair of socks, candy bar (big hit at Christmas), and we have ordered Easter tracts. The committee is inviting churches to write cards of encouragement and hope to the inmates. Bro. Matt Boyd asked if this would require any changes to the policies and procedures manual. - The moderator stated that the Personnel committee would be presenting changes during their report.

(7:48) **Baptist Center** - Ms. Penny Lambert shared that "great things have been happening at the Baptist Center." She invited all to come take a tour of the facility because God has been doing some amazing things. Since the last report, the Baptist Center has taken in \$2,406.10. Buck Creek Men's ministry installed a new ramp on the side of the store. Three college girls from KWC have come and painted a mural of the Tree of Life. Crossview Youth ministry brought over 300 boxes of clothes for the store. Saturday provided a giveaway, and they celebrated praying over others in the rain. The food pantry "is exploding." They gave away 148 boxes to help 539 people. Partnering churches have been essential for providing these services and keeping the food pantry open each month. They have a partnership with Perdue that provided 21 cases of chicken. Freezers have been donated and one purchased. The center provided miscellaneous items for 16 families. There have been 3 "Free Saturdays." The first Saturday (January) provided 11 coats. The second Saturday (February) provided 20 coats. The third Saturday (March) provided 30 coats. All leftovers go to the Help Office. All of this has been possible because of God and the 13 volunteers totaling 765 hours of service.

Bro. Clive Bell made note of the need for prayer for Penny's daughter for both physical health as well as her salvation of her and her husband. Bro. Conner prayed.

(7:55) **Dental Missions & WMU**- Diane Thacker shared that the Chaplain for the mission has stepped down and they are looking for someone to help 1 Friday a month to sit and share the Gospel with those who come for dental assistance.

The WMU report can be found on page 7. April 10-11 will be the WMU Annual meeting. The WMU wants to support and partner with you and your ministry. A list of events can be found on page 21 that are opportunities to witness, share and pray.

Bro. Silas Deane desired to draw attention to the Kentucky Changer event at Oneida Baptist Institute on March 18-21 and that they have work and need help.

(8:00) **Schafer Baptist Camp Program Ministry** - Sharon Westerfield began by sharing page 7 of the report has an error regarding Missions Camp grades. It is supposed to be grades 2-6. She also commented regarding the many volunteers across all of the DMBA ministries that "there is never a time that you're going to volunteer that you are not going to get more out of it than the people you work with." There will be 2 Children's Camps - Missions Camp (July 13-16) and Limitless Camp (July 17-20). She has served for 48 years and it has been a pleasure and a blessing to serve. Ms. Jenny Roberts highlighted the Missions Camp Flyer sharing that the theme for Missions Camp will be "Under the Sea - Discovering God's Love." - Ephesians 3:16-21. Bro. Tony Shouse will be camp Pastor. "Come meet Dinky and Dot."

(8:03) **Youth Camp** - Bro. Dustin and Audra shared that Youth camp will be July 5-9 and will be for grades 6-12. There is a flyer with a QR code to register for camp. The theme will be "Exchange - God loved us First." Ms. Audra echoed Sharon Westerfield's words stating that she was a product of that camp. And now to go full circle and do ministry with her husband at Youth camp. She stated that if you have ever been to Youth camp, "it is a sight to see." She shared that they do camp a little different in that it is not churches in a cabin, but rather students are separated by ages allowing them to get to know kids their own age outside their own church. Brycen Ballard will be doing music this year.

Old and New Business (8:07) -

There was no old business

(8:07) **Personnel Committee** - Ms. Sara Schroader brought a report and motions regarding two items.

- The Committee has been and continues to look at an increase in the number of hours at the Baptist Center Director. This will not move forward at this time.
- The Committee brings a ***motion to change the job description for the Jail Ministry***. This description can be found on page 20. Coming from committee and not needing a second, and being no discussion the **motion was approved** by ballot.

(8:09) **Finance Committee** - Bro. Tom Pelphrey shared that the committee has been working with the Trustees to provide improvements to the Baptist Center which now has new lights. The trustees have requested updates for flooring. The committee brings a ***motion to approve the recommendation from the Trustees' accepting bids for new flooring at the Baptist Center***. The cost would not exceed \$10,000 and come from the Legacy Fund (current balance is approximately \$800,000).

As part of questions, Bro. Conner showed the carpet squares (rectangles). Ms. Penny shared that the original intent was to try to clean, but due to excessive wear and tear, a recommendation to replace was made. Someone asked if the excess carpet could be brought to the Dental clinic, and the answer of "maybe" was given. **The motion was approved** by ballot.

(8:11)- General Information -

1. Bro. Conner shared that the Nominating Committee is seeking to set locations for Executive Board meetings next year. There is a vacancy for March. A poll was given regarding interest in attending Schafer Baptist Camp for this meeting. The general consensus was that the majority was interested.
2. Bro. Nathan shared that he was supposed to have shared that a generous donation was given to Schafer Baptist Camp. The Camp Development Committee has chosen to use that donation to install an outdoor basketball/pickleball court, an indoor volleyball court and an outdoor 3D archery event in the woods.
3. Brian Roberts asked to keep Apollo Heights in prayer as they go to Africa.
4. Bro. Conner reminded the Board of the Pastor Appreciation event at Buck Creek

(8:16) - **Correspondence** - Bro. Shea Hicks shared the following correspondence.

- A thank you note from Oneida Baptist Institute for allowing them use of the Baptist Building apartment.
- A note of appreciation to Schafer Baptist Camp with an anonymous donation of \$35,000 to the ministry of Schafer Baptist Camp.

(8:35) - **Motion to Adjourn** - A motion to adjourn was made and Seconded. Bro. Conner closed the meeting in prayer.

A MESSAGE FROM YOUR MODERATOR

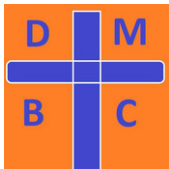

We are continually being blessed by God to provide our needs, praying with the people.

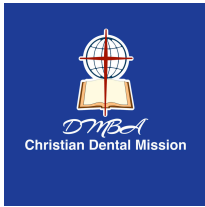
